

HEAR SOCIO ECONOMIC DISADVANTAGE DARE DISABILITIES /SLD

Applications must be made by February 1st. Consult CAO Handbook for full details.

Meeting Entry Requirements Course Order of Preference

3. Points - Order of Merit

Minimum Entry Requirement

- Students must meet Minimum Entry Requirements before they may be considered for entry to their chosen courses.
- Consult prospectus/ college website for details and information before applying for any course.
- Regardless of the points you achieve, you will not be accepte by a HEI if they do not meet their Minimum Entry Requirements.
- Minimum Subject Requirements + Specific Subject Requirements.

Minimum Entry Requirements:

- **NUI Colleges**: UCD, UCC, Maynooth University, NUIG, RCSI, St. Angela's College and Shannon College Require:

- 2 H5 + 4 O6 English, Irish, Maths & <u>3rd Language</u> (<u>Except Science, Social Science, Engineering and Nursing</u>) No Maths requirement- Arts, most Law courses.
- Trinity College
- 3 H5 +3 O6 English, Maths & 2nd Language
 DCU
- 2 H5 + 4 O6 English <u>or</u> Irish, Maths
- I.T's Level 8 = $2 H_5 + 4 O6$ English or Irish, Maths
- **I.T's** Level 6/7 = 5 O6English or Irish, Maths



Specific Subject Requirements Primary Teaching – H5 in Irish (H4 in 2019)

- Engineering (Level 8) H4 Mathematics
- Veterinary Medicine H5 Chemistry
- Human Nutrition/Dietetics H5 Chemistry
- Pharmacy H5 Chemistry



POINTS System:



• Calculated from **ONE** sitting of the Leaving Certificate.

• SIX best subjects

 Bonus points awarded for Honours Maths (25 points for H6 and over)

• Entry Requirements can be satisfied over more than one sitting of the LC (except for Medicine).

Higher Level Maths Bonus Points

Rachel's results:

- Irish H3 77
- English H₃ 77
- Maths H6 46+25 = 71
- French H₃ 77
- Biology H1 100
- Geography H1 100
- History H₃₇₇
- = **508** points

For Rachel, there is no benefit from the bonus, i.e. even after adding 25 points to the Maths score, it is still not one of her best six scores.

CAO Offer Process




 Students will be offered a place in the highest of their course preferences to which they are entitled (if any) on both Level 8 and Level 6/7 Course Choices.

• Students are automatically excluded from all lower preferences.

• Even if they have accepted their first offer they may subsequently be offered and accept a higher preference, if it becomes available in Round 2, 3, etc.

How places are allocated



These are the applicants for CK101 Arts in UCC. The examination results have not yet been released, so these applicants are in no particular order.

How places are allocated \oplus HI

• When examination results are released in August they are entered into the CAO computer.


- For each course the applicant has applied for, the computer first determines if the applicant has the Minimum Entry Requirements for the course.
- If the applicant meets the <u>Minimum Entry</u> <u>Requirements</u> for the course, the applicant's points are calculated for this course choice.
- All eligible applicants are then placed in a list, in order of academic merit (highest points to lowest) for each course that they applied for.

Applicants are placed in a queue for each course they applied for, their position in the queue is determined by their points. The applicant with the highest points is placed at the top of the queue. The points achieved by the applicant in red determines her position in the queue for each course she applied to.

How places are allocated HII

• NB: The admissions officers of the Higher Education Institutions tell CAO how many places are to be offered on each course.

 CAO then makes offers to the required number of applicants on each course <u>starting with the applicant with the</u> <u>highest points</u> and working down until enough places have been offered. The applicants marked in green have enough points to be offered places. The applicant marked in red has enough points for <u>her second preference</u>.



GENUINE ORDER





Students do not need to guess what the points are going to be for the courses they are interested in.

Offer Clarification

Let's say we have two CAO applicants:

*Mary & Alice both met UCD's minimum entry requirements

Mary achieved 499 points **1st choice: Engineering UCD 499pts** 2nd choice: Engineering TCD 470pts 3rd choice: Engineering DCU 381pts <u>Alice achieved 499 points</u> 1st choice: Law & Business TCD 589pts 2nd choice: Business & Law UCD 529pts **3rd choice: Engineering UCD 499pts**

Mary was offered her 1st choice, because she achieved the number of points required for her first choice. She will not receive another offer in a later round.

Alice was offered her 3rd choice because she achieved the number of points required for her third choice, but not enough for her first two choices. She could potentially get her first or second choice in later offer rounds.

If random selection were to be applied for Engineering in UCD, Mary would not be given priority over Alice just because she had the course down as her 1st preference vs. 3rd, since Mary and Alice achieved the same points.

MEDICINE

To compete for entry to undergraduate medicine students must:

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achieve a minimum of 480 points
 meet the Minimum Entry Requirements and
 sit the HPAT Ireland test.
 Adjusted Leaving Cert. Scale – (Max. 565)

• The points and the minimum entry requirements must be achieved in ONE sitting of the Leaving Cert.

• The HPAT test results is valid for 1 year.

MEDICINE



HPAT-Ireland:

- Health Professions Admission Test (Max.300) (2014: 155 – 230)
- Max 300 + 565 = Total Score Max. 865
- 2.5 hour Multiple Choice paper-based test.
- Students must first apply to the CAO <u>www.cao.ie</u> to get their CAO number.
- Then they must apply directly to ACER. This is done online €135 and includes test papers.

Medicine 2017

- The minimum combined score was 732.
- The minimum points at which anyone was admitted were 543 (which required HPAT of at least 191).
- The minimum HPAT score at which anyone was admitted was 172 (which required at least 606 points).


