Loreto Past Pupils:

Noeline Blackwell, CEO of the Rape Crisis Centre

If there is anyone who best embodies the Mary Ward ethos, it is Noeline Blackwell, CEO of the Rape Crisis Centre.

Noeline came to Loreto on the Green from Tipperary as a boarder. Her father was the creamery manager and wanted his three daughters to study higher level maths, so they had to travel to school. Her Aunt was a Loreto Sister at the Abbey, so it was arranged that Noeline and her sisters would attend the Green. Her memories of boarding in 1968 were of a frugal regime. The milk was watered down in the refectory - for the daughter of the creamery manger, there could be no worse fate. Noeline remembers arriving with a large trunk with hand-sewn Cash's labels on all clothes. Family visits were hosted in the parlour and there was sometimes the odd trip to the Indian Tea Shop or out for chips. There were limited trips home, which fostered a strong community spirit among the Green Boarders.

On the academic side standards were high - the girls were expected to focus on work and to meet their potential, very much like now. Noeline said that she didn't appreciate the education she was receiving at the time but remembers how the girls were encouraged and respected as individuals.

Noeline said she had had many excellent teachers in the school. Sister Lyola, who taught Maths, and Ms. Lavelle, who encouraged her love of English and Poetry. Her funniest memory though, is of the etiquette classes, which were provided by the glamorous Ms Begley. Noeline recounts the main etiquette skills as follows

- How to walk downstairs in a ballgown, how to politely refuse wine when offered a second glass, how to eat spaghetti without bending down, how to cross legs at the ankle and not at the knee, and most importantly, how to avoid sweaty hands (by resting hands like open flowers on one's lap).

It was totally surprising to hear how young Noeline chose Law in UCD. She had planned to apply for Froebel teaching, but a chance discussion with a friend changed her mind. She guoted from Robert Frost and simply said that she took the road less travelled. Law was less popular at that time, and she had no legal connections, but she took the chance, and it took her on an incredible career path. She also mentioned that volunteering along the way brought her from practise to her most recent roles in Free Legal Aid and the Rape Crisis Centre. She laughingly said that she might still go back to teaching one day, and we discussed how challenging it is for people to know the right path to take.

She quoted Jane Hirschfield's poem China –

"Whales follow the whale-roads.
Geese, roads of magnetized air.
To go great distance,
exactitudes matter.
Yet how often
the heart
that set out for Peru
arrives in China,
Steering hard.
consulting the charts
the whole journey."



The morning heralded bright and dry. Giving impetus to the dressing plans, make-up scheduling, taxi planning.... how the plans rushed the parents' waking thoughts. Arriving at the venue the cacophony of happy voices filled the atrium outside the function room; Mums rushed to greet fellow Mums, new parents were introduced through mutual acquaintances, the atmosphere was joyful. There were murmuring about a special guest of honour was coming and indeed when the parents entered the room Sister Orla had indeed attended.

Our festivities started with an address by Orla Treacy described to us western pampered mothers the average journey one of her pupils endures to attend classes; young boys facing death threats due to inter-tribal vendettas. Our greedy giddy laughter was hushed to hear of the risks undertaken to lift these children out of certain perpetual poverty.

Ms. Catherine Bent, our Parents' Association Chairperson quoted from Mary Ward's writings, reminding all of us present, the expressed ideology of the founder of the Loreto Order. All settled to eating, laughter and playful spot-prize ticket pulling. Donations to the Rumbek, South Sudan cause were secured and by now new parents were settling into yarns of the older parents' experiences. A strangely attired gentleman interrupted the gaggle of sounds: he said he was a Conrad staff chef on his last day at work who wished to sing to us of his home country, Italy. Aah, but he toyed with our innocent acceptance when he broke into a deep baritone voice singing of his love of

home. He whipped his delighted audience into audience participation by ordering us to wave our white napkins high at arm's length in rhythm with his singing. The room became transformed into a cloud of white cotton waving in the air by delighted parents captivated by the theatrical images of his songs. Yes, we were no longer in Dublin but on a seat in an operatic amphitheatre in Verona! Sister Treacy and Sister Brigid were drawn into the sea of white napkins as were Ms. Dempsey and Mr. Fitzgerald! To the courageously industrious parents' lunch sub committee, we say congratulations and roll on 27.03.2020. I for one have the taxi booked, now for the Gúna.....

The achievements in 2018 to 2019 have been memorable in both junior and senior debating. The senior debating team won the senior all Ireland debating competition and the Aoife Begley memorial competition as well as the Inter Loreto debating competition. Not to be outdone, two of the junior debaters have come in the top 15 in the national Junior Mace. It is a great testament to the 5th year debating committee that so many juniors are involved and doing well in competitions – and they have been wonderful mentors to the girls.

- 1. **Junior Debating** 2 girls are ranked in the top 15 speakers in Leinster (Asha Rait & Kate McGowan)
- 2. **Senior Debating** 2 girls will represent Ireland during the Summer and 5 qualified for international competitions in both Oxford and Cambridge Universities this year. (Sophie Bannon & Caoilainn Carey, pictured below)

As all parents of debaters know, the nights leading up to a competition result in much more robust discussions than the usual chats about school, TV, music, sports, etc. The dinner table becomes a mini debating chamber looking at topical issues, politics, geo-political situations, the different sides of debates, how we got here, the rights and wrongs – the list goes on and on! It makes for some lively, interesting and challenging discussion especially if there is a referendum coming up. Topics include setting up a separate country for women, the Republican Party should not nominate Donald Trump and should we have an Irexit?

It is a great training for their life ahead and indeed their schoolwork as many essays and questions on papers involve analysis of current affairs, in many languages. Debaters have to be aware of so many different issues and topics, as they can be asked to speak on practically any topic with only 20 minutes to prepare their arguments, points of clash and rebuttal. In writing about debating, I must also mention Mr. Mulligan. I regularly meet him mid-week at UCD and on weekends at whichever school the competition is in. (He gives the girls the opportunity to learn, grow and take on greater responsibility. You can see the success of this at both the Junior and Senior levels.





On 12th April the fifth year Art Class held the first Portrait Artist of Loreto the Green competition. The competition is modelled on the Sky Arts show 'Portrait Artist of the Year'. It was open to all students and there were 17 participants, from all year groups. The competition was held in the school canteen and participants had 2 hours to complete a portrait drawn from life. Our models were past pupils, Jill Deering and Orla Comerford and current fifth year student Maria Doyle.

During the morning each class had an opportunity to visit the canteen and watch the drawing process. It was a very enjoyable event and the standard and variety of portraits was outstanding. A huge congratulations goes to our winner, Laura Holloway in first year and our two runners up, Emma Chi (4th year) and Emer Connolly (6th year). The winner was chosen by the Loreto Education Officer, Ms Caroline Clarke and Sam Horler of the Drawing Studio, along with two fifth year students. The event was a fantastic end to a busy term and a wonderful showcase of the creativity and talent of the students.
