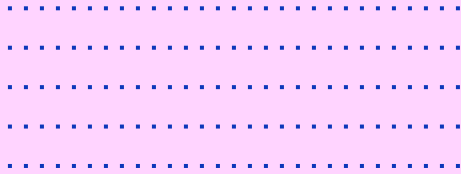

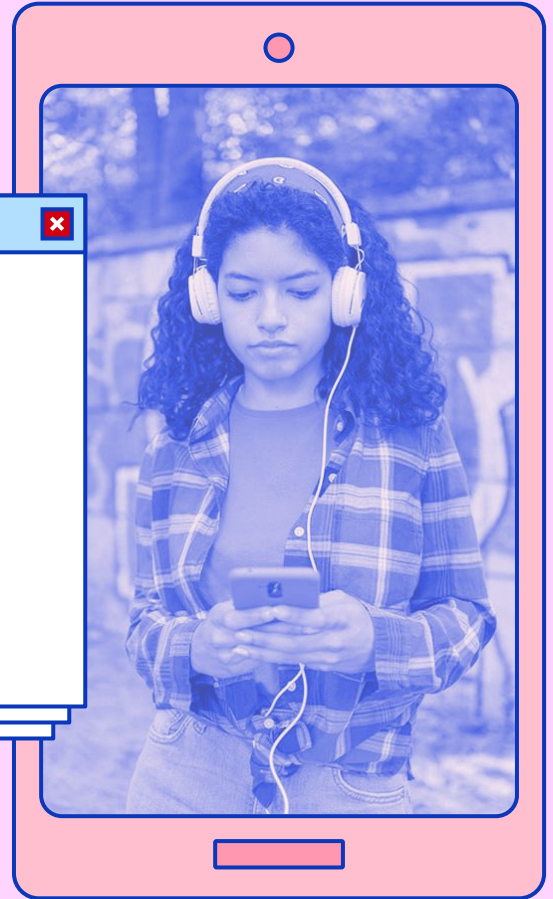

Making Friends Online




- It can be a great thing! Talking to mutual friends, people with the same interests & friends who live far away

If you're meeting in real life:


- Meet in a public place

Fake Accounts

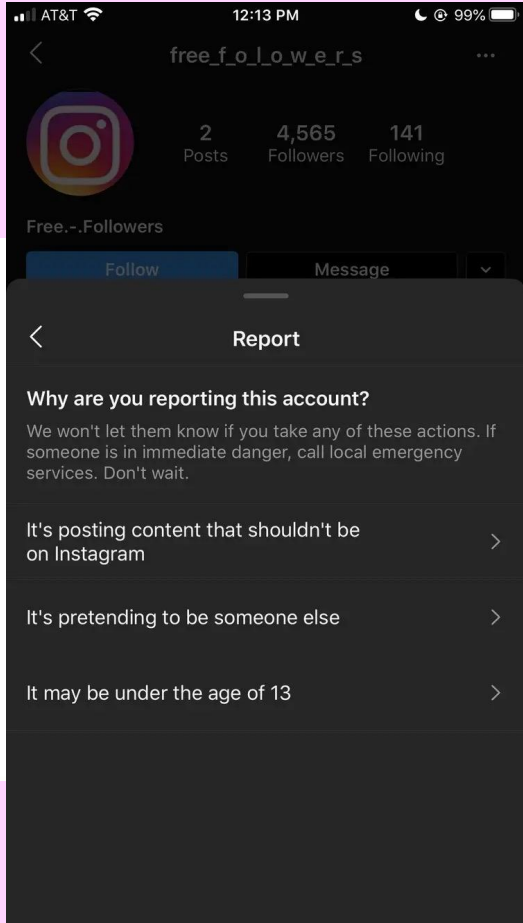
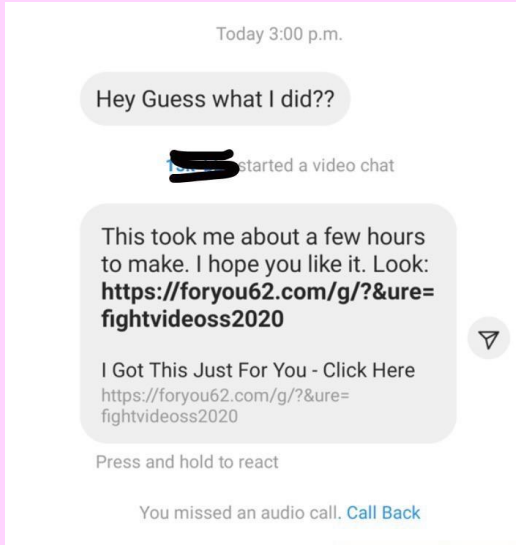
- Check who they are following & who follows them

- If in doubt, delete or block

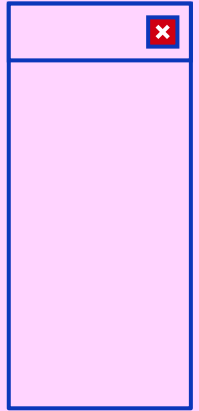
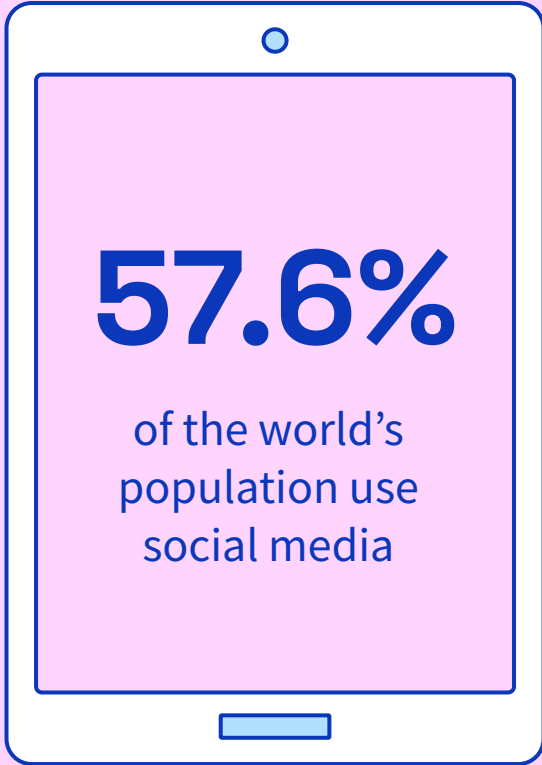
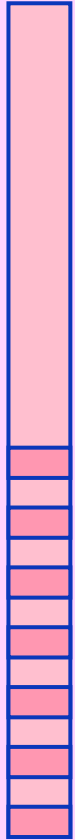


DM requests

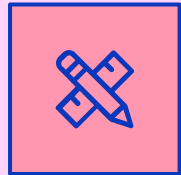
- Check your requests often

Don't open links or share a link unless you're expecting it



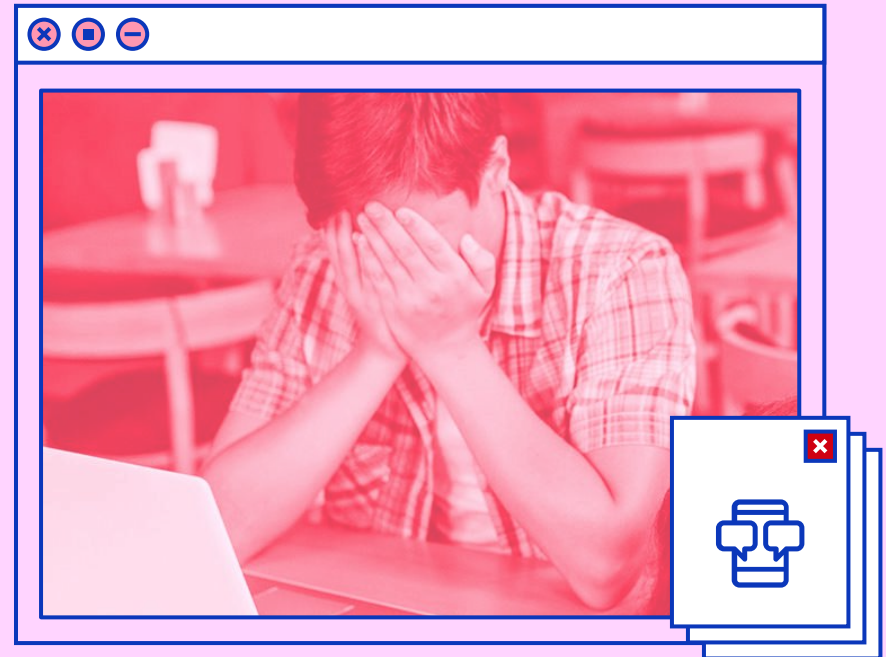
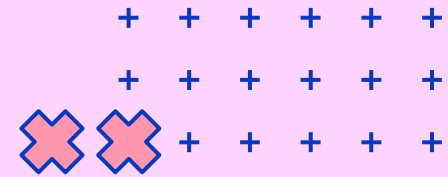
Unknown

Reposting

Double check what you're reposting! Is it necessary/factual?



Being Kind



- Follow people you know- don't be that person!
- Ask consent to post photos
- Research causes before reposting them
- Have your pronouns in your bio, make others feels welcome
- Choose your words carefully- don't use offensive slang
