Provide an appropriate and robust learning experience and environment Nurture respectful and caring relationships between teachers and students




Respect and honour diversity, entering into genuine dialogue with unfamiliar cultures and new developments Collaborate with parents in accompanying each student's progress towards maturity

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

Accelerated Reader Programme



- Helps ALL students become better readers, from students with special needs, to those who are avid and confident readers.
- Accelerated Reader: Provides the opportunity to read for at least twenty minutes each day.
- Encourages reading of both fiction and non-fiction.
- Evidence based reading programme.
- Shows that when students books at their appropriate level, they grow in confidence and reading stamina.

Accelerated Reader Programme



- All 1st years are enrolled in the AR programme.
- All 1st year students have taken the STAR reading test.
- Their reading ages have been established and books appropriate to their reading age are colour coordinated in library.
- Students will complete a quiz when they finish their books and will hopefully progress in their reading.
- We need your support. We ask that you encourage your child to complete their 20 minutes per day of reading.
- DEAR Time (Drop Everything and Read) on the 4th December and in March. The whole school community including parents will be asked to Drop Everything and Read for 20 minutes. Send in photos of you reading at work or at home on that day.

Homework Policy



- Homework is intended to reinforce the work that has gone on in the classroom, and may take many forms including project work, written assignments, digital presentations, pic collages etc. It may also include instructions to the student to go back over the materials covered that day in class.
- 1st years should not spend more than 1.5 hours completing same. If the student is struggling to complete work beyond that point, the parent can write a note to the teacher explaining same.

1. Guiding how to take personal responsibility for their choices.

2. Giving space to experience the consequences of their choices.

3. Help them understand that failure can be one of their greatest teachers.

4. Letting them know that they have what it takes to make their own decisions.
